


HOMEOWNERS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Kinship care is the full-time care, nurturing and protection of children by relatives, members of their tribes or clans, godparents, stepparents, or any adult who has a kinship bond with a child (Child Welfare League of America, 2011).

According to the Kinship Care Resource Center at Michigan State University, approximately 52,000 children in Michigan are being raised by relatives.


