#### SEPTEMBER: GRANDPARENTS APPRECIATION MONTH!

Catholic Charities Washtenaw County celebrates all grandparents who have taken on the rewarding but sometimes challenging role of providing kinship care. Per the September 2024 Annie E. Casey Foundation report, in Michigan, 3% of all kids — 55,000 — are placed with their kin rather than in non-related foster care homes.

Studies show that children placed with kin experience:

- Increased stability
- A greater likelihood of achieving permanency
- Better behavior and mental health outcomes
- Enhanced sense of belonging and acceptance
- Increased likelihood of living with and staying connected to siblings
- A greater preservation of cultural identity, community, and connection to extended family<sup>1</sup>

Grandfamilies provide a safe and nurturing home for grandchildren. We salute you!

## PARENTS OVERWHELMED?

Try these quick and easy breathing techniques for instant stress relief:

#### **Box Breathing**

Follow the four steps below to create a box pattern in your breathing. Repeat the cycle four times.

- **I. Inhale:** Breathe in deeply through your nose for a count of four.
- **2. Hold:** Hold your breath for a count of four.
- **3. Exhale:** Slowly breathe out through your mouth for a count of four.
- 4. **Hold:** Pause and hold your breath again for a count of four.
